Report on Webinar on Sensitization on Ragging, Laws/Regulations, and Live Case Studies

The National Medical Commission (NMC) has been receiving a significant number of complaints related to ragging, particularly from first- and second-year MBBS students. Most incidents are reported from hostels and campuses and involve physical violence, verbal abuse, intimidation, extortion, and severe mental harassment. In some tragic cases, such acts have led to extreme psychological distress and even suicide.

In view of this serious concern, and in alignment with the NMC Anti-Ragging Regulations, 2021 and UGC Regulations, a webinar titled “Sensitization on Ragging, Laws/Regulations, and Live Case Studies” was conducted on 29 January 2026 at 2:30 PM for the faculty and students of Vedantaa Institute of Medical Sciences.

The objective of the webinar was to create awareness about the legal provisions related to ragging, the strict punitive measures prescribed (including suspension, expulsion, cancellation of admission, and criminal prosecution), and the importance of prevention and early intervention. The session also emphasized that ignorance of the law is not an excuse for either students or institutions.

Members of the Anti-Ragging Committee (ARC), Anti-Ragging Squad, Hostel Committee, Dean, MBBS students and senior students actively participated in the webinar. The speakers discussed real-life case studies, the psychological impact of ragging on students, and the need for empathy, vigilance, accountability, and mental-health awareness in academic institutions.

The webinar highlighted preventive strategies, timely action, identification of root causes, and the collective responsibility of all stakeholders in ensuring a safe and supportive campus environment. Participants were sensitized to their roles in maintaining dignity, respect, and zero tolerance toward ragging.

The session proved to be informative and impactful, reinforcing Vedantaa Institute of Medical Sciences’ commitment to creating safe, dignified, and supportive medical campuses.
